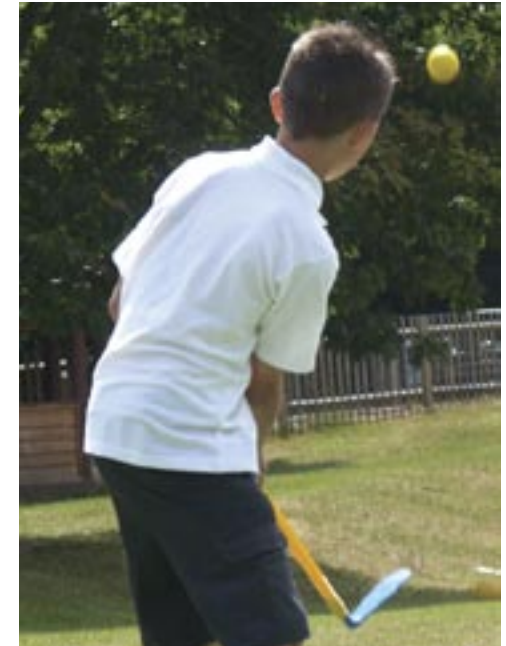


## Give golf a 'Tri' with Burning2learn and HSSP...

Burning2Learn and The Howard School Sports Partnership is dedicated to developing Tri Golf as well as the full game. This is the first time Tri Golf has been offered to schools in Medway and we were all overjoyed by the response. Over 40 schools came back to us to ask for Tri Golf coaching for their pupils.

Trying to hit the target of 2 hours Physical Education a week can be tough but with the help of Burning2Learn and The Howard SSP this was made available to schools. A breakfast, lunchtime and after school club has been offered in the first term and it has proved to be overwhelmingly successful. Over 97% attendance throughout the 6 week program is a fantastic response of commitment from schools and pupils to show they are enjoying the sessions.

In these classes students learn the fundamentals of golf, ranging from putting to the full shot. With the ability to practise their skills within fun games, students get so much out of it. Away from the physical side of the sessions pupils also take part in 'Tiger Says' which helps them learn the terms and words involved within golf as well as showing great sportsmanship.



Twydall Infant School, Mierscourt Primary and Thamesview Infant School were the first to experience Tri Golf coaching with a Burning2Learn Coach and we have had great feedback from the teachers and students, quoting that over 90% of students felt they improved through the sessions.

With such enthusiasm for the game of golf, students and teachers can benefit from taking part in the sessions, it is great to install into PE lessons and also to build a strong relationship between students and their teacher outside of school time.
